#### More information

Cpl Carter Palmer graduated from Yale University in 1942 and was employed at Brown and Sharpe Manufacturing Company's apprentice school in Providence.

He volunteered for the US Army in Providence, Rhode Island on 17 September 1942. He was selected for Army Specialized Training Program (A.S.T.P.) and attended University of Alabama and Georgetown University. He was transferred to the Office of Strategic Services in Washington, DC on 18 October 1943. On 6 October 1944 he was transferred to the Infantry and was sent overseas as a replacement in February, 1945.

Cpl Palmer was instantly killed when hit by shrapnel from an enemy shell.
