1st Lt John Badura graduated from East Evening High School and attended the College of Forestry at Syracuse University. He had been employed by H.B. Graves Company.

Lt Badura was killed when his airplane was hit by enemy machine gun fire on a patrol flight over the Rur River, Germany.
