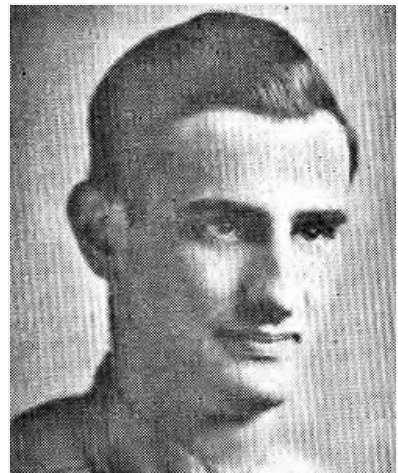
## More information

Pfc Morton T. Wolson attended college for one year before he joined the U.S. Army Reserve in New York City, New York on 26 May 1943. He was sent overseas in October 1944.

He was first buried at the Temporary American Military Cemetery in Limey, France.
