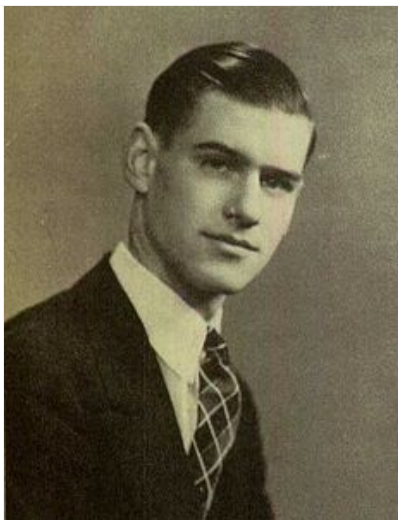
Pvt John W. Angwin enlisted in Manchester, New Hampshire on 6 October 1944.
