Lt Martin P. Bulgar was a graduate of Annunciation High School.

Ship 438 was attacked by fighters at time of bombs away. It was last seen going down out of control and no chutes were observed. 2nd Lt Martin P. Bulger Jr. Seriosly injured by gunshot wounds to both legs. He was dropped with his parachute above Bozum, after landing, he dies on the ground. His remains are buried on December 24, 1943 in the little cemetery of Skillaerd, near Mantgum, about 9 Miles from the place where his crew crashed.

On November 5, 1945 he reburied in a temporary grave at Margraten.

His photo was later used on a poster in Detroit advertising war bonds.

His brother Pvt Robert J. Bulger is buried next to him.
