S/Sgt Arthur L. Everett attended high school for four years.

He volunteered for the Air Corps of the Army of the United States in Rochester, New York on 15 July 1942.

After making a second run on the target, the group turned to return to their home base. At that moment it was attacked by enemy fighters from a nine o'clock angle. This B-17 was hit by 20 mm canon fire which caused to #3 gas tank and, soon, the entire inboard section of the right wing to burn furiously. The aircraft left the formation, still under control, in an easy, slightly diving turn to the right, turning back into enemy-occupied territory.

Six crew members survived and were taken prisoner, four were killed.
